### Why FAEIS?

Being a Tribal Land Grant institution means you are eligible to receive grants for educational programs from the USDA. Generally speaking, the USDA funds projects for Food and Agriculture, Forestry, Natural Resources, Environmental Conservation, Human Sciences and other related sciences. These are the same programs that FAEIS collects data from all the Land Grant institutions, including the tribal institutions.

The USDA funds a broad range of programs supporting educational institutions across the United States. Adding your institution's data to FAEIS will help the USDA better understand enrollment trends at Native American institutions, and enable the USDA to plan grants programs that benefit your students.
